

Dear parishioners,

May God's grace and peace be with you. In this month of November, we remember in prayer our loved ones who passed away.

The roots of this noble Christian tradition of praying for the dead comes from our understanding of purgatory. Our catechism states,

All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. (CCC 1030-1031)

Saint Paul writes about this process of purification in his First Letter to the Corinthians, 3:12-15:

If anyone builds on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, or straw, the work of each will come to light, for the Day will disclose it. It will be revealed

Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one.
And you shall love the Lord
your God with all your heart
and with all your soul

with fire, and the fire [itself] will test the quality of each one's work. If the work stands that someone built upon the foundation, that person will receive a wage. But if someone's work is burned up, that one will suffer loss; the person will be saved, but only as through fire.

As our loved ones in purgatory undergo this process of purification before being with God in Heaven, our prayers for them are an act of charity and a help for them.

We also pray to the dead to intercede for us to God. In Saint Paul's Letter to the Hebrews, chapter 12, he alludes to the "cloud of witnesses" who spur us on in our own race here on earth through their prayers to our heavenly Father.

Throughout this month of November, be assured of my prayers for your loved ones
